GATHER TOWN INSTRUCTIONS

To access Farpoint on GatherTown, use this link:

https://gather.town/app/YRPETqgYG6KzZ5nF/FarpointCon Enter the one-time password: **StarTrek**

What you need:

- A desktop/laptop with a mic and camera.
- A web browser (Chrome or Firefox recommended).
- We strongly recommend using **headphones** to help prevent feedback.
- That's it! There's nothing to install, no software to download.

How it works:

- Gather is a video chat platform that has avatars move around a map. As you get close to other avatars, your videos will pop up and you will be able to chat.
- Move around the space using the arrow keys.
- By moving your avatar around you can have spontaneous conversations with those around you. These can be either one-on-one or small groups depending on how many people are around your avatar.
- When your avatar moves closer to an interactable object, it will glow yellow and there will be a notification that shows up saying 'Press x to interact with -object-'. This can range from informational flyers, playable arcade games, integrated Zoom meetings, and more!

Lower Toolbar Icon explanations:

Change your **avatar** character and clothing by clicking on the character; you can shuffle through several 8-bit variations to find your best you!

Click on your name to open the **settings** menu, where you can:

- Edit Your Name
- Change User/Video Preferences
- Turn On Quiet Mode (if you don't feel like chatting)
- Reset Position (click this, and you'll be whisked back to the lobby!)
- Sign In (if you want to create a GatherTown account)

Mini map to preview the space you're in.

Screen sharing ability.

Emotes that appear above your avatar.

- Applause
- Heart React used to show caring or approval
- · Party Popper Celebrate/Party
- Thumbs Up a way of showing general approval
- Question Mark
- Raise Hand Techs will be looking for this and will come over to help you as soon as they have time. This is the only one that shows up on the Participants List. It is also the only one that stays up until you bring it down.

Side Toolbar Icon Explanations:

Another way to access **Settings** is to click on the gear icon located on the left side of the page. Here you'll be able to access the same menu as you did by clicking on your name in the lower toolbar.

The next symbol you'll see is a **Calendar** icon. You'll click on this to see what events are upcoming and which room they're in.

Below the calendar icon there's a **Chat Bubble** icon which you'll click on if you want to chat. You'll be given the option to select Nearby where it'll send to everybody within a certain radius, Everyone which will message everybody that's currently logged into Gather Town or you can private message by clicking on an individual user's name.

The last icon is the **Participants** that will show everybody who is currently active or has been active very recently (roughly a 15 minute window of going inactive). Right clicking on the name will give you a menu where you can private message someone, locate someone, or follow someone.

GatherTown will ask to access your microphone and your camera. If you wish to interact with others on the virtual con floor, you will need to allow access to both.

Type your name in the block below "What Is Your Name?" and press the "Join the Gathering" button.

You're now in the lobby of our virtual Farpoint! Use your arrow keys to move around. In the lobby you will see:

- A Tech Support area: move your character onto one of the chairs in this area and a tech guru will help you with any problems you may have
- A Schedule area: move your character onto one of the chairs and access the convention schedule
- An Info area: move your character onto one of the chairs and chat with staff at our information desk
- There are tables and chairs in the lobby; move your character onto one of the chairs, and you can talk with other folks at the table
- Cinnamon Tree Restaurant/Polo Bar & Lounge: two more areas where you can hang out and chat with other con goers.

Explore Virtual Farpoint!

Just like the Hunt Valley, we've set up an upper level and a lower level filled with convention fun! Wander the corridors of our virtual convention space to find:

Upper Level:

- Pool two hot tubs areas where you can hang out and chat
- Art Show with links to artists' websites
- **Gaming** walk up to a table and join a game!
- Green Room for panelists to hang out (requires a password to enter)
- Staff Room for staff members to hang out (requires a password to enter)
- · Access points to the Lower Level

NOTE: The rooms in the "Glass Hallway" (Tack, Derby, Chase, Belmont) are located on the Lower Level of the Virtual Hunt Valley

Lower Level:

- **Panel Rooms** check the sign in front of the room to see the schedule of panels going on in that room. The sign will glow yellow and there will be a notification that shows up saying 'Press x to interact with -object-'; press x on your keyboard to "attend" the panel!
- Dealers Area with links to dealers' websites
- Ballrooms check out our virtual Ten-Forward happening in the Valley & Hunt Ballrooms with a music playlist courtesy of Vic's Place and the Pack Ratz!

DISCORD INSTRUCTIONS

The Farpoint Discord server can be found at

https://discord.gg/NVxrsSgd8M

This should bring you to either the web or if you already have it installed, the desktop application and straight to the Farpoint server.

When you join the server you will see 2 channels. The rest are hidden until you accept our **Code of Conduct**.

- The first channel is called Help! This is if you are having problems accepting the Code of Conduct or any other technical issues.
- The second is 01-START HERE! This is where you should start. In that channel you should see a message that has our Code of Conduct. To accept the Code of Conduct click the thumbs up directly below that message.
- Once you click this you should have more channels show up including Channel 02-Interests which should be your next place to go.

In this channel you'll see the categories **After Panel Discussion**, **Fan Tables**, **Dealers**, and **Gaming**, each one with its own icon. Clicking on that icon below the message will turn on that category so you can see it in the sidebar. Clicking it again will turn it off.

This is so that you can see only the content you are interested in. You can come back at any time to change these choices.

Once you have selected which categories you're interested in please move on to the **03-Introductions channel**. In here please post who you are and how people would know you in meatspace.

Now you're on the server!

In front of the channels on the sidebar you'll notice two different symbols. A # or a **speaker** symbol. The # marks a text channel, the **speaker** symbol an audio & video channel, which you can join to have discussions with up to 25 users in a single channel.

To join an audio channel, click the channel. At the bottom of the channel list a box will appear with a **mute button**, a **deafen but-**

ton to turn off your speakers temporarily, a **video button** to turn on and off your camera and a **screen share** to share things such as photos of your dogs, or costumes or whatever you'd like to share. You'll also see a little **phone icon** with an 'x' as the way to leave an audio channel.

You can be in only one audio channel at the same time but you can hop between text channels at the same time.

In the category **General Discussions** we have a channel called **Announcements** where you can go and see announcements including schedule postings.

Other channels in the **General Discussions** category are **General**, **Lobby**, **Polo Lounge and Bar**, and **Frankie and Vinny's**. All these places are for general discussions of any topics which you would normally have in convention hallways.

Other categories you may have turned on are

- After Panel Discussions which is sorted by room, please keep the discussions to the rooms that correspond with the panel subject.
- Dealers and Fan Tables are places to chat with whichever dealers and fan table host might be around at the time
- **Gaming** where games such as horizons, jackbox games, and possibly table top rpg's will be hosted.

Each category has a caret symbol next to it, clicking on that collapses the list of channels within or brings them back. When the category is collapsed, you will see channels that have unread messages only under that category.

By clicking on the caret next to the server name and going to **Notification Settings** you can change which notifications you get from this server.

While Discord has a large variety of other features these are the ones we feel should be highlighted.

In Memoriam



Bob Ahrens

"Auto parts professional, former Boogie Knight, part time actor, full time karaoke star, legend in nobody's mind."

That self-description barely begins to describe Bob Ahrens, a long-time member of local fandom who passed away in December 2020.


Bob was a con fixture, attending his first con in 1976 and the first Shore Leave in 1978. As a high school senior, he met Lance Woods, John Scheeler, and David Keefer (later his best man and ushers), forming a friendship based on fandom, music, and a love of performing. Somewhere along the way, a melting pot of "Weird" Al Yankovic, Monty Python, and a "Medieval Disc Jockey" Masquerade entry sparked inspiration and led to the founding of The Boogie Knights, a medieval-themed filk group. Bob was proud to perform as Syd de Vicious.

Over the years Bob appeared in the Shore Leave Showcase and Cheap Treks, even taking a turn at writing and directing. He worked Security, joined the tech crew Conventional Magic, and

was a valued behind-the-scenes volunteer in countless Masquerades. No matter what, he helped make sure that the show would go on.

He is survived by his wife and daughter.

In Memoriam



Ponch Fenwick

Fandom suffered a great loss when Ponch Fenwick passed away in March 2020. A longtime fan of sci-fi, horror, and fantasy, Ponch was always ready to lend a hand when needed and a creative influence throughout his life.

A member of both STARFLEET and STAT, and a Lifetime Member of Farpoint, Ponch could be found at Farpoint, Shore Leave, Horrorfind, Mid-Atlantic Nostalgia Con, and many other area conventions as well as serving as Technical Liaison Committee Head for Shore Leave. After extensive self-training in Lightwave 3D, Ponch created a first-place winning image for Farpoint's art show in 2001. The piece, entitled "It's A Good Day," depicts three Klingon K't'inga Class Warships in space.

Ponch continued to expand his artwork and created works across many fandoms. His artwork was featured in the Harford County Cultural Arts Board's venue for the month of July 2017. The "Art Without Boundaries" display included two of his pieces. He also turned his hand to book covers for some of Fapoint's

author guests such as Phil Giunta and Steven H. Wilson.

His commitment to charity will be remembered. In particular, the Julien Fleming Memorial Fund, the Red Cross, and Special Olympics benefited by his assistance and generosity.



John Billingsley

Best known to Star Trek fans for his role as Dr. Phlox on Star Trek: Enterprise, John Billingsley got hooked on acting early – starring as Ebeneezer Scrooge in A Christmas Carol at age nine. After graduating from Bennington College in Vermont with a degree in theatre, he moved to Seattle and began a theatrical career. While in Seattle, he was a founder of Book-It, a theatre company, and Freehold, an acting studio; both are still thriving.

Relocating to Los Angeles in 1995, John quickly became a familiar face on-screen, racking up scores of credits on shows like *The Pretender, X-Files, Gilmore Girls, Touched by an Angel, The West Wing, Six Feet Under, Angel, Nip/Tuck, CSI:NY, NCIS, CSI: Crime Scene Investigation, Grey's Anatomy, Leverage, The Mentalist, Revenge, Southland, Hawaii Five-0, Castle, Lucifer, and The Rookie.*

In addition to *Enterprise*, John was a series regular on *The Others*, *The Nine*, and *Intelligence* and had recurring characters on *NYPD Blue*, *Cold Case*, *True Blood*, *Prison Break*, *Nikita*, *Suits*, *TURN: Washington's Spies*, *Masters of Sex*, and *Stitchers*.

Audiences have enjoyed several "meta" roles John has taken, including playing himself in an episode of *Roswell* that used the Enterprise set and guest starring in an episode of *Stargate SG-1* as a scientist who is also a Trekkie, "worshipping at the altar of Roddenberry". His memorable turn on *The Orville* episode "Home" as a grieving father seeking vengeance saw him ruthlessly targeting the character played by Robert Picardo (The Doctor, *Star Trek: Voyager*)

John's feature films span genres, from A-list titles like *Out of Time* opposite Denzel Washington), *High Crimes* with Ashley Judd, and disaster flick *2012* to indies such as *Trade of Innocents*, *A Green Story*, *Sironia*, and *Losing Control*.

John is married to actress Bonita Friedericy, leading to his self-description on social media as "Mr. Bonnie". He is proud to serve as President of the Hollywood Food Coalition (hofoco.org), which has been serving those in need since 1987. The Coalition provides a warm, nutritious meal along with access to basic daily needs, such as clothing, backpacks, sleeping bags, and hygiene items, as well as assistance with housing placement and referrals.

Dr. Paul Abell

Paul Abell is the Chief Scientist for Small Body Exploration in the Astromaterials Research and Exploration Science Division at the NASA Johnson

Space Center in Houston, Texas. His main areas of interest are physical characterization of near-Earth objects (NEOs) via ground-based and spacecraft observations, examination of NEOs for future robotic and human exploration, mitigation of potentially hazardous asteroids and comets, and identification of potential resources within the NEO population for future in situ utilization.

He was a science team member on the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA) Hayabusa near-Earth asteroid sample-return mission and participated in the successful recovery of the spacecraft's sample return capsule, which returned to Woomera, Australia in June 2010. Paul is currently a team member of the Hayabusa2 mission and is aiding the cooperation between Hayabusa2 and NASA's OSIRIS-REx spacecraft teams as they investigate and sample their respective near-Earth asteroids.

Since 2006 Paul has been a member of an internal NASA team that has been examining the possibility of sending astronauts to NEOs for human missions. He is also an investigation team member on both NASA's Double Asteroid Redirection Test (DART) and Near-Earth Object Surveyor Mission (NEOSM) planetary defense missions, and a team member on ESA's own planetary defense mission named Hera. Asteroid 8139 (1980 UM1) is named Paulabell in recognition of Paul's contributions to NEO research and exploration studies.



Danielle Ackley-McPhail

Award-winning author and editor Danielle Ackley-McPhail has worked both sides of the publishing industry for longer than she cares to admit. In 2014 she

joined forces with husband Mike McPhail and friend Greg Schauer to form her own publishing house, eSpec Books (www.especbooks.com).

Her published works include six novels, Yesterday's Dreams, Tomorrow's Today's Memories. Promise, Halfling's Court, The Redcaps' Queen, and Baba Ali and the Clockwork Djinn, written with Day Al-Mohamed. She is also the author of the solo collections A Legacy of Stars, Consigned to the Sea, Flash in the Can, and Transcendence, the non-fiction writers' guide, The Literary Handyman, and is the senior editor of the Bad-Ass Faeries anthology series, Gaslight & Grimm, Dragon's Lure, and In an Iron Cage. Her early television appearances include Mad About You, Buffy the Vampire Slayer, The Practice, and The Drew Carey Show. Further television work includes Family Law, 3rd Rock from the Sun, Strong Medicine, Spin City, Becker, Dharma & Greg, Malcolm in the Middle, Scrubs, Alias, Angel, Veronica Mars, Bones, Criminal Minds, CSI:Crime Scene Investigation, Monk, Without a Trace, Parks and Recreation, Castle, Justified, Hart of Dixie, and The Good Doctor.

Her recurring roles are featured on *The West Wing, My Name is Earl, The* Starter Wife, Twentysixmiles, How to Get Away with Murder, American Crime Story, The Friendless Five, Impastor, Preacher, and Dwight in Shining Armor.

Bonnie has acted alongside her husband John Billingsley several times. She played his on-screen wife in three episodes of *The Nine* and the film *Madtown*. She did *not* play his wife in her appearances on John's

series Star Trek: Enterprise and Intelligence.

Film appearances include Malaika, The Pornographer, The Debtors, Par 6, House of Sand and Fog, Christmas with the Kranks, Akeelah and the Bee, Stay, Next, South of Pico, Alien Raiders, Percy Jackson & the Olympians: The Lightning Thief, Paranormal Activity 3, The Lords of Salem, Shotgun Wedding, and Salt Water, on which she also worked as producer.

She provided the voice of resistance leader Caroline Becker in the 2014 video game Wolfenstein: The New Order.

Bonnie dedicates herself to the Hollywood Food Coalition (hofoco.org) as Co-Director of the Community Exchange Program. The Coalition is proud to have served 1,500,000 meals and counting, every night of the year since 1987.


When not writing, Eric is probably in Skyrim VR.
