

Carlos Alazraqui

Odds are, you know Carlos Alazraqui's face or you've heard his voice. He was Deputy James Garcia on Comedy Central's hit show and movies *Reno 911!*. He's a 3-time Annie Award Nominee for Outstanding Achievement in Voice Acting in an Animated TV/Broadcast Production and won in 2017 for Ponce de León in *The Mr. Peabody & Sherman Show*. He was the voice of Mr. Crocker (and Mrs. Crocker!) on *Fairly OddParents*. He taught us all to say "¡Yo quiero Taco Bell!" as the famous spokes-Chihuahua. He's also been a standup comic for over 25 years, a well-known television/film actor and one of LA's top voiceover actors with hundreds of credits to his name.

Farpoint attendees also know Carlos as Admiral Buenamigo, a recurring character on *Star Trek: Lower Decks*. This makes him the second member of his family to appear in one of the new Trek series after daughter Rylee.

Television audiences have seen Carlos as Officer Alvarez in *Kevin can Wait*, Dr. Moncada on Jane the Virgin, Sammy Tucker on *Bones*, Detective Nash on *Adam Ruins Everything*. He has voiced Rocko of *Rocko's Modern Life*, Spyro of *Spyro the Dragon*, Mayor Temoroso in the *New Adventures of Puss in Boots*, King Magnus in *Sophia the First*, and Skylar in *Elena of Avalor*, to name just a few of his roles.

On the big screen, Carlos played Hector in *Dance Baby Dance*, Carlo in *Take the Ten*, and Bob in *Funhouse Massacre*. You can also hear Carlos as the voice of El Chupacabra in *Planes*, Amos in *Free Birds*, Nestor, the Latin Penguin, in *Happy Feet* and *Happy Feet 2*, as well as Chuy and General Posada in *Book of Life*, and the sexy Brazilian Helicopter Pilot and Dad's Fear in *Inside Out*.

His writing credits include the comedy *Witness Infection*, where rival mob families accidentally assigned to the same small town are caught in a zombie uprising, six episodes of *Dads in Parks*, and the mockumentary short film *The Last White Dishwasher*, which he also executive produced. Carlos also served as executive producer for the TV movies *Reno 911!: The Hunt for QAnon* and *Reno 911!: It's a Wonderful Heist*.

Carlos had a Showtime special and a Comedy Central Half Hour Special as well as several other national television appearances including three spots on the *Late Late Show with Craig Ferguson*. Carlos works with Stephanie Miller every Wednesday on his *Coffee with Carlos* segment on the *Stephanie Miller Radio Show* on Free Speech Radio. He has also produced his own web series cartoon on Mondomedia.com called *Off The Curb*, which played live to a sold-out crowd in the YouTube Lounge at San Diego Comic-Con.

Christopher Abbott

Christopher Abbott is a Reader's Favorite award-winning author of crime, fantasy, science-fiction, and horror

Described by New York Times Bestseller Michael Jan Friedman as "an up-andcoming fantasy voice", and compared to Roger Zelazny's best work, Abbott's *Songs of the Osirian* series of works brings a bold re-telling of Ancient Egyptian mythology. Abbott presents a fresh view of deities we know, such as Horus, Osiris, and Anubis. He weaves the godlike magic through musical poetry, giving these wonderfully tragic and deeply flawed "gods" different perspective, all the while increasing their mysteriousness.

His Sherlock Holmes stories, published in the *Watson Chronicles Series*, have been recognized by readers and peers alike as faithfully authentic to the original Conan Doyle. In 2022, after publishing seven individual Watson Chronicle stories, Christopher teamed up with prolific authors Michael Jan Friedman and Aaron Rosenberg to add a collection of Holmes short stories to the series.

Christopher has published with Crazy8Press and written for major media outlets, including ScreenRant.

Award-winning author, editor, and publisher Danielle Ackley-McPhail has worked both sides of the publishing industry for longer than she cares to admit. In 2014 she joined

Her published works include eight novels, Yesterday's Dreams, Tomorrow's Memories, Today's Promise, The Halfling's Court, The Redcaps' Queen, Daire's Devils, The Play of Light, and Baba Ali and the Clockwork Djinn, written with Day Al-Mohamed. She is also the author of the solo collections Eternal Wanderings, A Legacy of Stars, Consigned to the Sea, Flash in the Can, Transcendence, Between Darkness and Light, and the nonfiction writers' guides The Literary Handyman, More Tips from the Handyman, and LH: Build-A-Book Workshop. Rylee Alazraqui is a new fan favorite thanks to her role as Rok-Tahk in *Star Trek: Prodigy*, the first *Star Trek* series specifically targeted at younger audiences and its first animated series to solely use 3D animation. It follows a group of young aliens who find the *USS Protostar*, an abandoned starship, and set off for the Alpha Quadrant. Rok-Tahk is a shy, 8-year-old rock-like member of the Brikar species who, being large and strong, defies being typecast as the ship's security officer and instead develops an interest in science.

Rylee is an 11-year-old Los Angeles native who started her entertainment career at the age of 6. Rylee's interest in performing was piqued after watching her dad, actor Carlos Alazraqui, go into recording studios and audition himself. After commercial bookings and several voiceover jobs, it became clear she had a knack for performing. Rylee is a proud member of the Screen Actors Guild. Her other roles include the voices of Julie in DreamWorks' *Doug Unplugs* and Grace in *Puppy Dog Pals*. In her free time, Rylee enjoys honing her softball and gymnastic skills, learning martial arts, and simply relaxing with good friends.

Dr. Patricia T. Boyd



Dr. Patricia T. Boyd is the Chief of the Exoplanets and Stellar Astrophysics Laboratory in the Astrophysics Science Division, and the Project Scientist for the Transiting Exoplan-

et Survey Satellite (TESS) Mission (a NASA Explorer Mission launched in 2018). She has been at Goddard since 1993, when she was a USRA visiting scientist with the High Speed Photometer and Polarimeter Team aboard the Hubble Space Telescope, studying the optical and ultraviolet polarization seen in X-ray binaries, pulsars and active galaxies.



Wilson Cruz

Wilson Cruz can most recently be seen on Star Trek: Discovery playing the role of Dr. Hugh Culber and on the Netflix series, Thirteen Reasons Why, playing the role of Dennis Vasquez. Early in his career, Wilson won the hearts of audiences playing Rickie Vasquez on My So-Called Life. Rickie was the first openly gay teenager role to air on network primetime television. He has continued to earn fans and critical acclaim on television, film and on stage.

Wilson's theatre accolades include his portrayal of the critically acclaimed role Angel on Broadway and in the West Coast Premiere of the Pulitzer Prize and Tony Award-winning musical Rent. His portrayal earned him The Los Angeles Ovation Award and Dramalogue Award. He also starred in Tick, Tick, BOOM! at the Westport Country Playhouse, West Coast Premiere, and its first national tour.

Wilson has also portrayed a long line of memorable and poignant characters on television, from one of TV's first transgender characters in an Emmy-nominated episode of Ally McBeal, to series regular roles on Party of Five and Rick & Steve the Happiest Gay Couple in the World.

Wilson recurred as Kenji Comez Rejon on FOX's ensemble drama, The Red Band Society, starring Oscar winner, Octavia Spencer. He has also appeared on Shameless, The West Wing, Noah's Arc, Pushing Daisies, The Closer, NCIS, American Dad, Related, Monk, ER, The Finder, and Hustling.

Wilson's career has equally translated to success on the big screen in both studio and independent films. His film credits include He's Just Not That Into You, Supernova, Nixon, The People I've Slept With, Party Monster, Coffee Date, Johns, All Over Me, and Meth Head.

On the frontlines of LGBT advocacy, Wilson Cruz recently served as the Director of Entertainment Industry Partnerships and as National Spokesperson for GLAAD, the nation's leading LGBT media advocacy organization. Wilson also executive produced a five-part docuseries, Visible: Out on Television, in 2020.

In 1995, Boyd joined the Monitoring X-ray Experiment team, an X-ray all-sky monitor that was in development and testing as part of the Russian-led Spectrum X-Gamma mission. In 1997, she joined the Rossi X-ray Timing Experiment Guest Observer Facility performing science support for that mission. From 2003 to 2008, she managed that facility, as well as the Swift Science Center.

Padi spent a two-year detail at NASA Headquarters in Washington as the program scientist for the Kepler mission. While at NASA Headquarters, she was also the NASA point of contact for the MOST U.S. Guest Observer program and also served as a discipline scientist for X-ray and gamma-ray astronomy. She was also the Program Officer for the Origins of Solar Systems Exoplanets program.

Since returning to Goddard in 2010, she has held a number of positions including Deputy Project Scientist for Operations of the Hubble Space Telescope, Associate Chief of the Astroparticle Physics Laboratory, Acting Deputy Director of the Astrophysics Division, and Associate Director of the Astrophysics Division.

Her research interests focus on applying traditional and novel time series and spectral analysis techniques to uncover the drivers of stellar variability, and accretion in compact binaries and active galaxies, using data from a variety of space telescopes.

Billy West

Doug Funnie, *Doug*. Bugs Bunny and Elmer Fudd, *Space Jam*. Ren **and** Stimpy, *The Ren & Stimpy Show*. Philip J. Fry, Professor Farnsworth, Zapp Brannigan, Dr. Zoidberg, Richard Nixon, *Futurama*. Billy West has been talking in funny voices since the '80s.

Born in Detroit and growing up in Boston, Billy studied at Berklee College of Music for a semester and then found himself in various bands, playing gigs by night and working in a music shop by day. He did daily comedy routines on Boston radio station WBCN's *The Big Mattress* show before eventually moving to New York and becoming a regular on *The Howard Stern Show*. During his seven years there, Billy delighted audiences with a wide range of character voices, ranging from classic TV personalities like Jim Backus, Raymond Burr, and Johnny Carson, to then-current newsmakers such as Leona Helmsley, Lance Ito, and Kathie Lee Gifford, to sports figures like Marge Schott, Evander Holyfield, and Al Michaels, to New York figures such as David Dinkins, Rudy Giuliani, and Cardinal O'Connor.

While still working in radio, Billy began doing the voicework that would make him a household favorite – though rarely under his own name! For Nickelodeon, he originated the title role of Doug Funnie on *Doug*, which he voiced for four seasons, and the character Stimpson J. "Stimpy" Cat for *The Ren & Stimpy Show*. Two seasons into that show's five season run, he also

took over voicing Ren Höek.

In 1996, Billy provided the voices of Bugs Bunny and Elmer Fudd in director Irving Reitman's *Space Jam* after Reitman himself asked Billy to audition. He later reprised both roles in several other feature length films.

Billy went to the *Futurama* auditions and was asked to try out for, as he says, "just about every part". He eventually landed the roles of Farnsworth, Zoidberg, and Brannigan. He later got the main role of Fry, which originally had gone to another actor. The voice he uses for Fry is often considered to be closer to his natural voice than any other character he has played; he has said that Fry is "just me at age 25". Both he and other Futurama cast and crew have remarked that Billy voices so many characters on the show that conversations are often held entirely between characters he is voicing. *Futurama*, a show that may be functionally immortal, begins a 20-episode season in 2023.



Russ Colchamiro

Russ Colchamiro is author of the scifi mysteries *Crackle and Fire*, *Fractured Lives*, and *Hot Ash*, the ongoing series featuring intergalactic private eye Angela Hardwicke. Russ is also

the author of the rollicking time travel/space adventure, *Crossline*, the SF/F backpacking comedy series *Finders Keepers: The Definitive Edition*, *Genius de Milo*, and *Astropalooza*, is the editor of the sci-fi mystery anthology *Love*, *Murder & Mayhem*, and co-author and -editor of the noir anthology *Murder in Montague Falls*.

Russ has also contributed to several other anthologies including *PRISM*, *Tales of the Crimson Keep*, *Pangaea*, *Altered States of the Union*, *Camelot 13*, *TV Gods 2*, *They Keep Killing Glenn*, *Thrilling Adventure Yarns*, *The Phenomenons*, *Footprints in the Stars*, *Devilish and Divine*, *Badass Moms*, and *Brave New Girls*.

Russ is a member of The Mystery Writers Association, The Private Eye Writers of America, and the author collective Crazy 8 Press. He also hosts and produces his "Russ's Rockin' Rollercoaster" podcast, where he interviews bestselling and up-and-coming sci-fi, fantasy, crime, mystery, and horror authors.

He lives in New Jersey with his wife, two ninjas, and black lab, Jinx.



Tom Hill started saying he wanted to be an aerospace engineer when he was six. Alive but not aware for Apollo, he grew up reading the stories of Apollo and of science fiction,

knowing he wanted to work on spacecraft. After high school, he attended Penn State University on an Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps

scholarship and graduated with a degree in aerospace engineering. Called to active duty in 1991, his first assignment was at Schriever (then Falcon) Air Force Base in Colorado Springs. There he worked on military weather and missile warning satellites and helped get 13 of the original operational 24 Global Positioning System (GPS) satellites into orbit.

His next assignment took him to Turkey, where he used RADAR to track satellites for Cheyenne Mountain. Serving there for a year, he tracked several space shuttle missions to the Russian space station Mir and even tracked the oldest object still in orbit, Vanguard 1.

After Turkey, he went to Vandenberg Air Force Base to work in launch. He served as the launch controller for a weather satellite, sitting in the last on-site blockhouse in the Air Force as a Titian II lifted off the pad. He assisted with other launches including a Delta II rocket and a Titan IV.

At this point he was married with a kid on the way, so Tom separated from the Air Force and went to work in the aerospace industry. He stayed in the Air Force Reserve, assigned parttime to two positions at the Pentagon and retired in 2014 as a Lieutenant Colonel. At his new company he worked with a new version of a weather satellite called the Geostationary Operational Environmental Satellite or GOES, being involved in the system from a critical design review through serving as a test director for the on-orbit satellite. He also worked with two land survey satellites called LandSats 5 and 7. One was launched in 1984 and served for 28 years. The other had launched in 1999 (while Tom was at Vandenberg) and was going strong as well. His work has involved international cooperation for an early form of space traffic control, early efforts for NASA's space asset protection, and reviews of several spacecraft in their design process.

He's written two books: Space: What Now?, a non-fiction book examining space policy options after the loss of Space Shuttle Columbia, and I want to go to Mars, an illustrated children's book about a young girl imagining what life would be like on the red planet. He's also written several articles for print and web media.

Tom is married to Deborah, and they have two grown children. His wife and daughter are here today.

Convention Attendance:

1. Farpoint is a public event and will take place regardless of weather or travel conditions. Convention membership tickets are nonrefundable. Attendees may resell or gift tickets privately, with notice to Farpoint of the registration name change.

2. Seating is on a firstcome, firstserved basis in all programming rooms. There is disabled Attendee and VIP (Guests and Staff) seating available in the ballroom. Please observe all reserved signs for these seats.

3. Purchase of a convention membership ticket does not guarantee a Guest's autograph. Attendees are responsible for attending the scheduled autograph session(s) to secure a Guest's autograph.

- e. Symbols or Statements of hate toward, but not limited to, a person's Race, Color, National Origin, Gender, Sexual Orientation, Age, Body Size, Disability, Appearance or Religion

2. The above harassing actions, symbols and/or statements are also not permitted as part of a presentation, panel, exhibit, show or cosplay. Farpoint in its sole discretion will determine if a harassing action or statement has occurred or symbol has been used. Farpoint Staff will take prompt action in any form deemed appropriate toward anyone found in violation of this policy, which can range from asking an Attendee, Staff or Guest to leave the convention floor for a specified time up to expulsion from Farpoint Convention with no refund or a lifetime ban from the convention.

3. Any Attendee, Staff, Vendor/Dealer or Guest experiencing an uncomfortable or unsafe situation is asked to bring the matter to the nearest Farpoint Staff member, identified by their convention badge. They will be escorted to the convention operations office to make an official report. Attendees, Staff, Vendors/Dealers and Guests may also go directly to the convention operations office, located in the Pimlico Room around the corner from Convention Registration on the lower level, as circumstances dictate. After making a report, Farpoint Staff will contact local law enforcement or medical assistance, provide an escort, offer a safe place and/or otherwise assist the Attendee, Staff, Vendor/Dealer or Guest to feel safe for the remainder of the convention.

4. Overtly sexual imagery and language is not appropriate except during events or panels specified as covering adult topics that are open only to Attendees over 18 years of age. Attendees violating these rules may be expelled from Farpoint without a refund at the discretion of the cochairs and/or committee.

5. Convention Attendees are expected to follow Maryland's Drug and Alcohol Abuse laws. The drinking age in Maryland is 21. Violation of these laws will result in immediate expulsion from the convention. The Delta Hotel requires all alcohol consumed in the bar, restaurant or convention space be served by hotel employees. Outside purchase alcohol must be consumed in the privacy of the Attendee's room.

6. Parents are responsible for the behavior of their minor children. If a child is seen behaving in a disruptive manner or in a way that might cause harm to themselves or others, Farpoint reserves the right to ask that the parent accompany the child when in convention areas.

7. Attendees should be aware that convention activities are often videotaped or photographed by other Attendees and the press. The photographer should ask for your permission prior to taping or photographing you at the convention. Attendees should be aware that they may appear in the background of someone else's video or photo and are responsible for notifying that photographer if they do not wish to be included in the image.

8. Celebrity Guests' contracts may prohibit videotaping of their stage ap-

pearance. An announcement will be made from the stage prior to the celebrity's appearance. Videotaping of other programming events is subject to the approval of the convention and person(s) on stage.

9. Video and still cameras may not be used to capture images in the Art Show or Dealers Rooms.

10. Requesting a Guest's personal information is considered a privacy violation and is grounds for expulsion from the convention. Examples include an Attendee asking a Guest for their hotel room number, travel itinerary or other contact information that the Guest considers private.

11. Onstage presentations of gifts or awards to or by any Attendee or Guest must be preapproved by the Farpoint cochairs. Making a presentation without this approval is grounds for expulsion from the convention.

12. No gunplay or swordplay is allowed at any time unless it is taking place at a demonstration event scheduled by the convention. All weapons must remain holstered or sheathed. Staff members may ask to inspect your weapon to verify it is a prop. When this happens, your weapon will be marked with a removable marker, such as a zip tie, to identify that the inspection has occurred. Items considered weapons include but are not limited to: paint ball or splatter guns; prop, blank or cap guns; laser tag guns; swords, lightsabers and similar articles with edges, blades and/or projectile capability. Laser target designators or laser pointers are not allowed in the convention areas (except as used by Guest speakers during a presentation) as they can cause injury if not used properly.

Service Animals and Pets:

1. The Delta Hotel allows pets in the sleeping rooms per their policy found online at https://www.marriott.com/hotels/factsheet/travel/bwidhdelta-hotelsbaltimorehuntvalley/. This policy limits Hotel Guests to 1 pet per room (pet maximum weight 50 pounds) with a nonrefundable \$75 fee per stay. The animal must not be left unsupervised in the sleeping room or the convention levels and must be on a leash when not in the sleeping room.

2. Animals are not allowed on the convention levels except for Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) service animals. Service animals must be leashed and always wear proper identifying tag, collar or vest on the convention levels. The ADA allows for trained service animals to accompany their matched partner in a place of business. Per the ADA, service animals are:

- a. individually trained animals matched with a specific disabled person to perform assistance tasks for that person; and
- b. working animals, not pets

The following animals are not considered service animals per the ADA and not allowed on the convention levels:

- a. household pets
- b. animals in training to be service animals who are not accompanying their matched partner; and
- c. animals used for emotional support or easing anxiety

This rule also applies to Search and Rescue (SAR) animals in training. A SAR animal is trained in public at either organized training events or only after permission is granted by the owners of the public premises for the training to take place. The hotel will not grant such permission unless the public event is an SAR training event or demonstration, which Farpoint is not.


3. All service animals on the convention floor are expected to behave in accordance with their training. Farpoint and the Delta Hotel will request the animal be removed if an animal becomes disruptive to the proceedings, to include (but not limited to) the following:

- a. Barking, growling, biting or snapping at Attendees, Staff, Vendors/Dealers or Guests
- b. Jumping on Attendees, Staff, Vendors/Dealers or Guests
- c. Knocking over, chewing on or otherwise damaging hotel or convention floors, furniture, equipment, displays and signage, including that of Guests, Vendors/Dealers and exhibitors
- d. Urinating or defecating on hotel or convention floors, furniture, equipment, displays and signage, including that of Guests, Vendors/Dealers and exhibitors
- e. Running loose on the convention floor and otherwise not staying with their matched partner while attending the convention

4. The seating area for disabled Attendees in the Valley Ballroom for main programming will include specified seats with enough floor space for an Attendee to keep their service animal safely next to them and out of the way of foot traffic. Attendees with service animals who do not utilize this reserved seating may be asked to relocate to this specific area and/or leave the ballroom if the Attendee places their animal in a way that blocks foot traffic or causes a tripping hazard for Staff, Guests and Attendees.

5. Anyone experiencing an issue with an animal in the convention areas is asked to go to the Con Operations office in the Pimlico Room, the Registration Desk on the lower level of the convention center or the Information Desk on the upper level of the convention center and ask for a convention chair to be contacted.
