

In Memoriam



Thomas Alan Chafin

When I first met Thomas Alan Chafin back in Ye '80s, my first impression was that he was a pedantic blowhard who knew far too much about *Star Wars, Star Trek*, Robert Heinlein and other aspects of s-f/fantasy than was healthy for any human being.

Decades later, I sat in a room full of people at his wake who said the exact same thing – and we were all missing him. I think I can speak for them and say we still do. That's because when T.A. (I never called him Alan, opting to use his pen name instead) wasn't trying to impress you, he was trying to let you know how much he valued your friendship.

One way he did that was by sucking you into one of his many, many adventures. Therein hangs my tale.

In July 1989, our comedy troupe, Cheap Treks, produced *Fandom at the Opera*, our take on the Andrew Lloyd Webber musical. Shortly after it ended, T.A. asked how long it would take to put together an edit of Conventional Magic's three-camera shoot of the show, because Vulkon in Orlando, FL, wanted to screen it that November.

So, tech maestro John Vengrouskie and I spent the ensuing months creating the first-ever fully edited Cheap Treks show. But how would we get it from the Baltimore/DC metro to Orlando? I didn't want to risk the mails

"I'll drive!" said T.A., as if heading out to a corner bodega that was just 15 hours away. "Come with me, Lance! It'll be an adventure!" His plan: Leave his Virginia home Friday night, drive to Orlando, crash for a few hours in our hotel room, take the tape down for the screening, sleep more, and leave for home Sunday morning.

My reply: "Uhh ..."

After much cajoling and pleading from him and my then-Mrs., we were off on the Road to Orlando. And as T.A. promised, it was an adventure, from the brief midnight pause at South of the Border ("The aliens have f'ng landed.") on the way down to the Vulkon screening (a success!) and the blown alternator in T.A.'s car that added hours to the trip home (but was replaced by T.A. MacGyver-style with one from a nearby junkyard).

All told, the expedition began at 5:30 Friday night from T.A.'s place in Virginia and ended when we pulled into our Maryland driveway at 2:00 am Monday morning.

Do I regret accompanying you on that insane journey, T.A.? Of course not ... 36 years later. I just hope that wherever you're headed next, you find somebody as reluctant and dumb as me to go with you so you can show them the good time – no, *times* – you showed me while you were here.

But please: no Star Wars trivia.

(YHouse lecture, Manhattan, New York, with Dr. Bow van Riper). and in astrophysics and elementary particle physics at NASA. He also managed educational web software development and joined in space mission proposal writing. He served as a Radiation Physicist (forecasting the solar and cosmic radiation doses that may be encountered by NASA space missions). He was also an adjunct Associate Professor at the University of Maryland University College, where he taught Introduction to Physical Sciences for six semesters.

His article "The Science in Star Trek" (http://www.nasa.gov/topics/technology/features/star_trek.html) is the most-read article about that topic on the Internet and has been widely republished. Consequently he has been consulted on futurist topics by Wired Online, The Economist, Star Trek Communicator, The San Francisco Chronicle, National Geographic Online, NBC Nightly News, and numerous other publications. He and William Shatner were guests on Neil deGrasse Tyson's Star Talk on the National Geographic Channel, 2016 December 19.

His first science fiction novel, *The Metalmark Contract*, was published in 2011 by Black Rose Writing. He has been working on part 2 of the Metalmark saga. His first science fiction short story was published in the April 2015 issue of *Communications of the Association for Computing Machines*. In January 2020, he was hired by Northrop Grumman Corp. as a Senior Principal Engineer, and he analyzes spacecraft electronic parts to ensure that space radiation will not disable them. He and his wife Laurie recently celebrated their 43rd anniversary.

Charles Blue has more than 35 years of strategic communications experience in science, engineering, and technology. He currently supports NASA's Exploration Systems

Mission Development Directorate. Previously, he served as the writer/editor for the National Science Foundation's Directorate for Engineering, public information officer for the National Academy of Engineering and the National Radio Astronomy Observatory.



Dr. Alan D. Bristow

Professor Alan D. Bristow received a Ph.D. in Physics from the University of Sheffield in 2004. He was a Post-doctoral Fellow at the University of Toronto and then a Research Asso-

ciate at JILA (a division of the National Institute of Standards and Technology at the University of Colorado-Boulder). Dr. Bristow was an Adjunct Instructor at Colorado School of Mines in 2009 and joined the faculty of West Virginia University (WVU) in 2010. At WVU, Dr. Bristow leads the Ultrafast Nanophotonics Group, which operates moderately intense laser sources with subpicosecond pulse duration for probing and controlling electrodynamic phenomena. The group explores light-matter interactions and photophysics in solids relevant to solar-energy harvesting and photodetectors in many regions of the electromagnetic spectrum. He is working on nonlinear and quantum optical processes for applications in the physical and life sciences. Dr. Bristow is a Senior Member of Optica (formerly OSA), a Feature Editor for Optical Materials Express, and an Associate at the National Institute of Standards and Technology. He serves as the Associate Chair of Graduate Studies and Research at WVU's Department of Physics and Astronomy.



Dr. Wesley Britton

For nearly two decades, Dr. Wesley Britton has hosted various online radio shows/podcasts featuring interviews with performers from a wide variety of entertainment ven-

ues. He currently hosts "Flashback with Wes Britton" and "Remember Again with Wes Britton" on the Artistfirst radio network reaching an average of 160-165 countries each month.

Wesley's publications include four nonfiction studies of espionage on television, film, and literature, including the highly regarded *Spy Television* (2004) and *Beyond Bond: Spies in Fiction and Film* (2005, both Praeger Pub.) He wrote six novels and three short story collections for his sci-fi series, "The Beta Earth Chronicles" beginning with *The Blind Alien* in 2015.

A retired college professor, Wes has presented programs at the International Spy Museum, the Mid-Atlantic Nostalgia Convention, Shore Leave and Farpoint fan cons, and many academic conferences featuring his expertise in the legacy of Mark Twain. He lives with his wife Grace in Harrisburg, PA.

a member of the "Exoplanets and Stellar Astrophysics Laboratory" at NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, MD. He enjoys photography and is an enthusiastic fan of exploration of the Universe in which we live, the Maryland RenFest, and all things Trek and Disney. Carpenter credits NASA's early space program, *Star Trek* and the 1964-65 New York World's Fair, which he attended as a child, with fueling his desire to work for NASA. He has been a speaker at various Star Trek and media cons, including Denver StarFest, Maryland's Shore Leave, and Atlanta's DragonCon.

Michelle Forbes

Born in Austin, TX, Michlle first caught the audience's eye and the critics' attention in the dual role of Sonni Carrera Lewis and Solita Carrera on *The Guiding Light*, earning a Daytime Emmy nomination in 1990. The next year she began her association with Star Trek by appearing as Dara in the Next Gen episode "Half a Life." This led to her casting as the recurring character Ensign Ro Laren, who appeared numerous times over the last three seasons.

Ro was such a fan favorite that Michelle was offered a chance to reprise the role on the new show *Star Trek: Deep Space Nine*. Turning down the offer, she concentrated on pursuing film roles. These include her Saturn Award nominated turn in *Kalifornia* (alongside such heavyweights as Brad Pitt, Juliet Lewis, and David Duchovny) and the female lead in *Swimming with Sharks*.

Baltimore fans are sure to recall her work as Chief Medical Examiner Julia Cox on the acclaimed *Homicide: Life on the Streets* and *Homicide: The* Movie (nominated for Best Supporting Actress in a Quality Drama Series). Brit TV fans saw her as the deaf wife of the main detective in the first three series of *Messiah*, performing solely through sign language.

The 2000's saw Michelle in some of the biggest shows around, featuring as presidential aide Lynn Kresage in 24 season 2, a guest spot on Alias, and then the key role of Admiral Helena Cain in the re-imagined Battlestar Galactica as well as Battlestar Galactica: Razor. She followed this up with a recurring role as Agent Samantha Brinker on Prison Break and guest starred on Boston Legal and Lost.

Michelle's trans-Atlantic work continued with roles on British tv and star turns in two American shows for HBO: as Kate Weston on *In Treatment* and as Maryann Forrester, the scheming maenad villain of *True Blood* season 2, winning the Saturn Award for Best Guest Starring Role on Television.

Continuing to work regularly, Michelle appeared in main cast and recurring roles including stints on *Durham County, Chicago Fire*, *Orphan Black*, *Powers*, and *Berlin Station*. Her most acclaimed role was as Mitch Larson, the grieving mother of a murder victim, in the first two seasons of *The Killing*. Most recently, Michelle reprised her role as now-Commander Ro Laren on Star Trek: Picard.

Joe frequently appears as a panelist, contest judge, and guest at pop-culture conventions nationwide. She's also worked on several fan films and voice-over projects based on *Star Trek, Judge Dredd, The Orville*, etc. She's been known to recreate exact costumes from movies as well as being commissioned to make them for several television actors and fan films alike. Joe worked with ThinkGeek on commercials advertising Star Trek products!

Joe is one half of Trek Girls (@trekgirls IG), a Star Trek stream as well as co-host of 'What's on Joe Mind?' on Podbean for the past 11 years, where she talks about the GI Joe brand, Hasbro, and all things nerdy! She also been on other podcasts talking anything Marvel/DC/Trek. She was the Commanding Officer for 8 years of "The Finest", a GI Joe-themed costume club, whose charity projects benefit military and veterans; bringing in over \$60K during her command.



Royce Essig has been an actor since the early 1990's, with stage, film, and commercial credits. His time with Rising Phoenix Productions let him also explore the behind the


scenes end of filming, leading him to learn editing and production.

David Gerrold's work is famous around the world. His novels and stories have been translated into more than a dozen languages. His TV scripts are estimated to have

been seen by more than a billion viewers.

He has worked on a dozen different TV series, including Star Trek, Land of the Lost, Twilight Zone, Star Trek: The Next Generation, Babylon 5, and Sliders. He is the author of Star Trek's most popular episode "The Trouble With Tribbles."

Many of his novels are classics of the science fiction genre, including *The Man Who Folded Himself*, the ultimate time travel story, and *When HARLIE Was One*, considered one of the most thoughtful tales of artificial intelligence ever written.

A ten-time Hugo and Nebula award nominee, David Gerrold is also a recipient of the Skylark Award for Excellence in Imaginative Fiction, the Bram Stoker Award for Superior Achieve-

ment in Horror, and the Forrest J. Ackerman lifetime achievement award.

In 1995, Gerrold shared the adventure of how he adopted his son in *The Martian Child*, a semi-autobiographical tale of a science fiction writer who adopts a little boy, only to discover he might be a Martian. *The Martian Child* won the science fiction triple crown: the Hugo, the Nebula, and the Locus Poll. It was the basis for the 2007 film *Martian Child* starring John Cusack and Amanda Peet.

Gerrold's greatest writing strengths are generally acknowledged to be his readable prose, his easy wit, his facility with action, the accuracy of his science, and the passions of his characters. An accomplished lecturer and world -traveler, he has made appearances all over the United States, England, Europe, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand. His easy-going manner and disarming humor have made him a perennial favorite with audiences. David Gerrold was a Guest of Honor at the 2015 World Science Fiction Convention.

Thomas Hill

Tom Hill started saying he wanted to be an aerospace engineer when he was six. Alive but not aware of Apollo, he grew up reading the stories of Apollo and of science fiction,

knowing he wanted to work on spacecraft. After high school, he attended Penn State University on an Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps scholarship and graduated with a degree in aerospace engineering. Called to active duty in 1991, his first assignment was at Schriever (then Falcon) Air Force Base in Colorado Springs. There he worked on military weather and mis-

sile warning satellites and helped get 13 of the original operational 24 Global Positioning System (GPS) satellites into orbit.

His next assignment took him to Turkey, where he used RADAR to track satellites for Cheyenne Mountain. Serving there for a year, he tracked several space shuttle missions to the Russian space station Mir and even tracked the oldest object still in orbit, Vanguard 1.

After Turkey, he went to Vandenberg Air Force Base to work in launch. He served as the launch controller for a weather satellite, sitting in the last on-site blockhouse in the Air Force as a Titian II lifted off the pad. He assisted with other launches including a Delta II rocket and a Titan IV.

At this point he was married with a kid on the way, so Tom separated from the Air Force and went to work in the aerospace industry. He stayed in the Air Force Reserve, assigned parttime to two positions at the Pentagon and retired in 2014 as a Lieutenant Colonel. At his new company he worked with a new version of a weather satellite called the Geostationary Operational Environmental Satellite or GOES, being involved in the system from a critical design review through serving as a test director for the on-orbit satellite. He also worked with two land survey satellites called LandSats 5 and 7. One was launched in 1984 and served for 28 years. The other had launched in 1999 (while Tom was at Vandenberg) and was going strong as well. His work has involved international cooperation for an early form of space traffic control, early efforts for NASA's space asset protection, and reviews of several spacecraft in their design process.

He's written two books: *Space: What Now?*, a non-fiction book examining space policy options after the loss of Space Shuttle Columbia, and *I want to go to Mars*, an illustrated children's book about a young girl imagining what life would be like on the red planet. He's also written several articles for print and web media.

Tom is married to Deborah, and they have two grown children.



Dr. Thomas R. Holtz, Jr.

Dr. Tom Holtz is Principal Lecturer in Vertebrate Paleontology at the Department of Geology, University of Maryland, College Park. His research focuses on the origin, evolu-

tion, adaptations, and behavior of carnivorous dinosaurs, and especially of tyrannosauroids (Tyrannosaurus rex and its kin). He received his Bachelors in Earth & Planetary Geology at Johns Hopkins in 1987 and his Ph.D. from the Department of Geology & Geophysics at Yale in 1992. Matthew Wood

Matthew Wood's relationship with Star Wars began long before he took on the task of voicing one of the most iconic modern characters.

Matthew began as a game tester at Lucas Arts before moving to Skywalker Sound, where he was a supervising sound editor on the prequel trilogy. In *The Phantom Menace*, he appeared as Bib Fortuna and provided the voice of Ody Mandrell. In *Attack of the Clones*, he played Seboca and Magaloof. But it was in *Episode III – Revenge of the Sith*, in addition to a brief appearance as Orn Free Taa, that Matthew took over the voice role of General Grievous, a part originated by voice actors John DiMaggio and Richard McGonagle in the series *Star Wars: Clone Wars*. In the film, Matthew provided the voice while stuntman Kyle Rowling physically portrayed General Grievous utilizing motion capture.

Matthew lent his voice to General Grievous in the *General Grievous Hallow-een audiocast* as well as all video game appearances of Grievous with the exception of *Star Wars Battlefront: Elite Squadron*. He continued to voice General Grievous as well as the battle droids in both the *Star Wars: The Clone Wars* film and television series. In the series, he also voiced Wat Tambor, HELIOS-3D, senate guards, and Poggle the Lesser. He provided the voice of RO-GR/Roger, a

reprogrammed battle droid in *Lego Star Wars: The Freemaker Adventures*. He reprised his role as Bib Fortuna, voicing him in *Star Wars: The Bad Batch*.

But don't think that voice work took up all of Matthew's time. In addition to remastering the sound for the original trilogy's Blu-Ray release, he found time for highly acclaimed sound editing on a number of films. Matthew has earned five Academy Award nominations for Best Sound Editing: Paul Thomas Anderson's *There Will Be Blood* (2007), Pixar's *WALL-E* (2008), *Star Wars: The Force Awakens* (2015), *Star Wars: The Last Jedi* (2017) and *Star Wars: The Rise of Skywalker* (2019).

Stephen Lesnik (CISSP-ISSEP-ISSMP, CCSP, CEH, CASP+, CySA+) has been in the cybersecurity and education fields for nearly forty years. He has a history of working with both gov-

How Bidding Works:

Bidders MUST be registered with the convention AND with the Art Show desk. Register your badge number at the Art Show desk so that your bid will count. Pieces with 6 BIDS or less when the Art Show closes on Saturday evening will be sold to the highest bidder on the card. Pieces with 7 OR MORE BIDS go to the live auction. If you place the seventh bid on a piece of art, plan to attend the live auction. The live Art Auction is SUNDAY starting at 11:00 AM in Art Show rooms. ALL registered convention members (one-day and weekend) may attend and bid at the live Art Auction.

If a bid has been made with a badge number that has not been registered with the Art Show, that bid will be voided.

Quick Sale on Saturday:

When our doors open on **Saturday morning**, if an item **DOES NOT** have a bid on it, it may be purchased at the **QUICK SALE PRICE** listed on the bid sheet. 

Farpoint Rules and Policies

Convention Attendance:

- Farpoint is a public event and will take place regardless of weather or travel conditions. Convention
 membership tickets are non-refundable. Attendees may re-sell or gift tickets privately, with notice to
 Farpoint of the registration name change.
- Seating is on a first-come, first-served basis in all programming rooms. There is disabled Attendee and VIP (Guests and Staff) seating sections available in the ballroom. Please observe all reserved signs for these seats
- Purchase of a convention membership ticket does not guarantee a Guest's autograph. Attendees are responsible for attending the scheduled autograph session(s) to secure a Guest's autograph.
- 4. You must wear your Farpoint badge to gain admittance to all convention areas. Badges are non-transferable. Lost badges will be replaced for a \$20.00 fee with proper photo identification.

Hotel:

- Causing a disruption in any part of the hotel (rooms or convention areas) is grounds for expulsion without a refund from the convention. Farpoint and the DoubleTree Hotel has sole discretion in determining the severity of the disruption.
- Smoking is prohibited in the hotel (tobacco products, e-cigarettes and vaping). Attendees should use designated smoking areas on the lobby level outside the hotel, which comply with Maryland requirements that smoking areas be 15 feet away from building entrances/exits.

Conduct:


- Farpoint does not tolerate harassment of Attendees, Staff, Vendors/Dealers or Guests by any other Attendee, Staff, Vendor/Dealer or Guest. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - a. Stalking
 - b. Intimidation
 - c. Offensive Verbal Comments
 - d. Physical Harassment and/or Unwelcome Physical Touching or Attention
 - e. Symbols or Statements of hate toward, but not limited to, a person's Race, Color, National Origin, Gender, Sexual Orientation, Age, Body Size, Disability, Appearance or Religion
- 2. The above harassing actions, symbols and/or statements are also not permitted as part of a presentation, panel, exhibit, show or cosplay. Farpoint in its sole discretion will determine if a harassing action or statement has occurred or symbol has been used. Farpoint Staff will take prompt action in any form deemed appropriate toward anyone found in violation of this policy, which can range from asking an Attendee, Staff or Guest to leave the convention floor for a specified time up to expulsion from Farpoint Convention with no refund or a lifetime ban from the convention or calling for police assistance.
- 3. Any Attendee, Staff, Vendor/Dealer or Guest experiencing an uncomfortable or unsafe situation is asked to bring the matter to the nearest Farpoint Staff member, identified by their convention badge. They will be escorted to the Con Operations office to make an official report. Attendees, Staff, Vendors/ Dealers and Guests may also go directly to the Con Operations office, on the convention floor, as circumstances dictate. After making a report, Farpoint Staff will contact local law enforcement or medical assistance, provide an escort, offer a safe place and/or otherwise assist the Attendee, Staff, Vendor/Dealer or Guest to feel safe for the remainder of the convention.
- 4. Convention Staff, Vendors/Dealers, Guests and Attendees are expected to follow Maryland's Indecent Exposure Laws. Clothing and costumes must fully cover their private parts. This law does not apply to mothers breastfeeding a child. Overtly sexual imagery and language is also not appropriate in programs, except during events or panels specified as covering adult topics that are open only to Attendees over 18 years of age. Attendees violating these rules may be expelled from Farpoint without a refund at the discretion of the convention chairs and/or committee.
- 5. Convention Staff, Vendors/Dealers, Guests and Attendees are expected to follow Maryland's Drug and Alcohol Abuse laws. The drinking age in Maryland is 21. Violation of these laws will result in immediate expulsion from the convention. The DoubleTree Hotel requires all alcohol consumed in the bar, restaurant or convention space be served by hotel employees. Outside purchase alcohol must be consumed in the privacy of the Attendee's room.
- Parents are responsible for the behavior of their minor children. If a child is seen behaving in a disruptive manner or in a way that might cause harm to themselves or others, Farpoint reserves the right to ask that the parent accompany the child when in convention areas.
- 7. Attendees should be aware that convention activities are often videotaped or photographed by other Attendees and the press. The photographer should ask for your permission prior to taping or photographing you at the convention. Attendees should be aware that they may appear in the background of someone else's video or photo and are responsible for notifying that photographer if they do not wish to be included in the image.
- 8. Celebrity Guests' contracts may prohibit videotaping of their stage appearance. An announcement will be made from the stage prior to the celebrity's appearance. Videotaping of other programming events is subject to the approval of the convention and person(s) on stage.
- 9. Video and still cameras may not be used to capture images in the Art Show or Dealers Rooms.

- 10. Requesting a Guest's personal information is considered a privacy violation and is grounds for expulsion from the convention. Examples include an Attendee asking a Guest for their hotel room number, travel itinerary or other contact information that the Guest considers private.
- 11. On-stage presentations of gifts or awards to or by any Attendee or Guest must be pre-approved by the Farpoint Convention chairs. Making a presentation without this approval is grounds for expulsion from the convention.
- 12. No gunplay or swordplay is allowed at any time unless it is taking place at a demonstration event scheduled by the convention. All weapons must remain holstered or sheathed. Staff members may ask to inspect your weapon to verify it is a prop. When this happens, your weapon will be marked with a removable marker, such as a zip tie, to identify that the inspection has occurred. Items considered weapons include but are not limited to paint ball or splatter guns; prop, blank or cap guns; laser tag guns; swords, lightsabers and similar articles with edges, blades and/or projectile capability. Laser target designators or laser pointers are not allowed in the convention areas (except as used by Guest speakers during a presentation) as they can cause injury if not used properly.

Service Animals and Pets:

- The DoubleTree Hotel allows pets in the sleeping rooms per their policy. This policy limits Hotel Guests
 to 1 pet per room (pet maximum weight 50 pounds) with a non-refundable \$75 fee per stay. The
 animal must not be left unsupervised in the sleeping room or the convention levels and must be on a
 leash when not in the sleeping room.
 - Animals are not allowed on the convention levels except for Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) service animals. Service animals must be leashed and always wear proper identifying tag, collar or vest on the convention floor. The ADA allows for trained service animals to accompany their matched partner in a place of business. Per the ADA, service animals are:
 - a. Individually trained animals matched with a specific disabled person to perform assistance tasks for that person; and
 - b. Working animals, not pets.
- The following animals are not considered service animals per the ADA and are not allowed on the convention floor:
 - a. Household pets; and
 - b. Animals used for emotional support or easing anxiety.
- In contrast with the Federal ADA laws, Maryland has modified the state ADA laws to allow service animals in training similar access to public spaces that is provided to fully trained service animals. However, both the Federal and Maryland ADA laws allow public events and spaces to ask for a service animal or service animal in training to be removed if said animal is not behaving in accordance with their training.
- 5. All service animals and service animals in training on the convention floor are expected and required by law to behave in accordance with their training. Farpoint and the DoubleTree Hotel will request the animal be removed if an animal becomes disruptive to the proceedings, to include (but not limited to) the following:
 - Barking, growling, biting, or snapping at Attendees, Staff, Vendors/Dealers, Guests or other Service Animals.
 - Jumping on or knocking over Attendees, Staff, Vendors/Dealers, Guests or other Service Animals.
 - Knocking over, chewing on or otherwise damaging hotel or convention floors, furniture, equipment, displays and signage belonging to the Hotel, Farpoint Convention, Guests, Vendors/Dealers, Exhibitors or other Attendees.
 - d. Urinating or defecating on hotel or convention floors, furniture, equipment, displays and signage belonging to the Hotel, Farpoint Convention, Guests, Vendors/Dealers, Exhibitors or other Attendees.
 - e. Running loose on the convention floor and otherwise not staying with their matched partner while attending the convention.
- 6. Federal and Maryland ADA laws do not apply to Search and Rescue (SAR) animals in training. A SAR animal is trained in public at either organized training events or only after permission is granted by the owners of the public premises for the training to take place. The DoubleTree hotel will not grant such permission unless the public event is a SAR training event or demonstration, which Farpoint Convention is not.
- 7. The reserved seating area for disabled Attendees in the Preakness Ballroom for main programming will include seats with enough floor space for an Attendee to keep their service animal safely next to them and out of the way of foot traffic. Attendees with service animals who do not utilize this reserved seating may be asked to re-locate to this specific area and/or leave the ballroom if the Attendee places their animal in a way that blocks foot traffic or causes a tripping hazard for Staff, Guests and Attendees.
- Anyone experiencing an issue with an animal in the convention areas is asked to go to the Con Operations office on the convention floor, Registration Desk or Information Desk in the hotel lobby and ask for a convention chair to be contacted.
